MR. BOND: I can give one specific example,
Mrs. bothe, and that is on the revolving credit bill.
The revolving credit bill, I am told by people on the
Legislative Committee and also by Attorney Hoff, represented certain clients, if the facts had been presented that
the Legislative Committee wanted, perhaps a proper credit
bill could have come forth. There are two terms where
the Legislature has not been able to ascertain the
facts involving credit, mercantile credit. That is a

DR. EARD: Mr. Chairman, I just make one comment. What happened last time and the discussion that is taking place here again makes me feel that we really are as of one. We want this power limited. Everyone on the Committee felt very strongly in this respect.

We feel that it ought to be germane. We think it ought to be used only when it is important. Furthermore, we want to find some way to protect the power. I don't think the debate is in philosophical belief here. The debate is rather in the wording, and I suspect that we this have not worded/in its best form.
