administrative agency by a simple majority.

MRS. BOTHE: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

Mr. Sykes?

MR. SYKES: I think Mrs. Bothe's suggestion applies the sanctions at the wrong point. If you are going to have to go through the machinery of getting two-thirds of the House to authorize the issuance of a subpoena, you are going to be clogging up the legislative calendar on matters that may not even be contested, and the time for the application of sanctions is when a bona fide dispute arises and so challenge is made to the appropriateness of the subpoena in the particular instance.

Most of the subpoenss will be honored as a are matter of course, and all you/doing is multiplying work, and I am against the proposal on that ground although I feel there should be safeguards before a subpoena can be enforced.
