who punishes in this situation, the Legislative Council, the Committee, or the Legislature as a whole?

MR. SYKES: I can answer that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

MR. MILLER: I would like if permitted to amend the, move an amendment to the proposal, and that is to just strike all of this Section out of the Constitution. We should leave this matter to the Legislature and the courts. We are hamstringing people, we are trying to keep this as short a document as we can --

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me interrupt. That suggestion was made earlier when you were out of the room, and nobody wanted to move it at that time. Would you accept such an amendment, Mr. Hoff?

MR. HOFF: No, sir.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then I would suggest instead

of making it as a substitute motion, make it as a separate

motion later if you would, please. Any further discussion?

MR. BOND: What is the motion before us now?

THE CHAIRMAN: Motion before you is that in order to compel the attendance of a witness against his
