will or production of books and records before the Legislature or any of the committees of the Legislature a two-thirds vote of the appropriate House would be required, I am sorry, a simple majority of those present of the appropriate House would be required.

MR. HAILE: I may answer my own question, I think. I think that means in a contempt proceeding a majority vote of the House is required. I think that is what we just voted, that is after a witness refuses to obey a subpoena.

THE CHAIRMAN: We are not trying, Mr. Haile, to phrase the language, we are simply taking the sense of the group, and I think Mrs. Bothe's original motion on which this motion is founded was that if the person were willing to appear voluntarily or produce the records voluntarily, it would not be necessary to have the vote of the House, but if the person objected to producing the records or appearing, that it would be necessary. We are not trying to get the language.

Mr. Case?

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I think that after
