broad concept that we have set forth, Mr. Sayre, throughout, namely, that certainly we have to have faith in this body that they are giving more and more power to.

Dr. Winslow has a point.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Winslow?

DR. WINSLOW: In reference to Judge Adkins' question about punishment, would you be better satisfied if the word were, disciplined? I would.

JUDGE ADKINS: I think this is a fairly broad power to say, may punish a Member without any limitation.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me call your attention --

Mr. Brooks has just handed me, called my attention to Section 23 of Article III of the present Constitution which says, Each House may punish by imprisonment during the session of the General Assembly any person not a Member for disrespect or disorderly behavior in its presence or for obstructing any of its proceedings or any of its officers in the execution of their duties, provided such imprisonment shall not at any one time exceed ten days.

DR. BARD: It is Section 19, Mr. Chairman.
