THE CHAIRMAN: The present Constitution.

MR. SYKES: Yes, of the present Constitution, the language apparently gave Mr. Sayre the trouble he had. There is a provision that no member shall be expelled a second time for the same offense. Now, that provision has been left out of the redraft. That provision also indicates that expulsion doesn't mean complete disqualification as a legislator, creating a vacancy, but means simply banish. From the right to take the floor or to be on the floor for a particular period. I would like to ask the Committee whether it meant any change in substance, or whether it so interpreted the word, expel, whether it means to broaden the power to expel and the effect of the power and why it was that the so-called double jeopardy provision was not included in the redraft.
