as provided by law. This in essence is the recommendation which we are making. I could give you some background in respect to the reason for this recommendation, Mr. Chairman, if you would like for us to do this.

THE CHAIRMAN: Very well.

DR. BARD: Not only are we making this recommendation because the model made it and because other study bodies such as the 29th American Assembly at Oregon House which was a very important body that studied state legislatures and American politics at this time but because we really believe it would be better not to set a target date that would hold true for every last legislative term.

By way of illustration, in our deliberations and discussions with members of the Committee of the Legislature which we referred to on numerous occasions the question was asked as to whether the Cooper-Hughes Bill might have gone through had there been a few more days. They said yes, it might have gone through had there been a few more days. They recognized that.
