THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment? 1 DR. BARD: I wouldn't object. I think it is 2 certainly implied, and we hope understood here. I see no 3 4 objection. THE CHAIRMAN: I would think it would be. 5 MR. HOFF: Actually, it is published many 6 months after the session, and if you wait for publication, 7 you may have to wait until the session is over. 8 MR. BROOKS: Since the sessions are public, I 9 think that would take care of it. 10 DR. BURDETTE: Yes, but some sessions are not 11 12 public. DR. BARD: I don't think we ought to belabor 13 the point. I think adding the word, public, would do 14 no harm, and might do some good. 15 THE CHAIRMAN: Any objection to that? If not, 16 it is so ordered. We move on to Section 16. 17 MR. DELLA: One question, Mr. Chairman, on 18 Section 15. I gather the feeling is that the legislation 19 is to be passed by the majority of the Members present 20 and not a constitutional majority as such? 21
