THE CHAIRMAN: This is a majority of the Members of the House which means elected. Section 16, on Page 9.

The House of Delegates shall have DR. BARD: the sole power of impeachment in all cases provided by law but a majority of all the Members must concur in the impeachment. All impeachments shall be tried by the Senate, but no person shall be convicted without the concurrence of two-thirds of all the senators.

MRS. BOTHE: Can we have an explanation?

It doesn't make sense to me. MRS. BOTHE: reads as though there are two contradictory powers granted, one to the Senate and one to the House.
