of the Legislature, one, they recognized that there was this flexibility, they thought this was a good recommendation. At one time when they first saw the recommendation they were concerned about the fact that they might not be able to adjust their own working schedule to any term that did not have a target date. But once they realized this did not necessarily mean that they would keep on meeting throughout the entire year, they realized that it could work within this frame of reference.

MR. MILES: I used to know the answer to the question but forgot it. How many states have a constitutional limit on the Legislature?

DR. BARD: Mr. Brooks might be able to answer that.

MR. BROOKS: I can't say offhand.

DR. BARD: We can answer it the other way.

We know Nebraska doesn't have a target date, New York

doesn't, Massachusetts doesn't. A goodly number of

states move within this frame of reference. More of

them seem to be moving as the model has made the

recommendation.
