1 to the law and evidence. THE CHAIRMAN: You accept that, Mr. Clagett? 2 MR. CLAGETT: Yes. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: The question now is on the 4 motion of Mr. Clagett to amend Mr. Sykes' motion. All 5 those in favor of the amendment, signify by a show of 6 hands. Contrary. The motion is lost, 4 to 16. The 7 question now arises on Er. Sykes' motion with the amendment 8 9 which he accepted. Any further discussion? Dr. Bard? 10 I like Mr. Sykes' motion because I 11 DR. BARD: think it puts the wording that we now have, it/sort of 12 negative form, places it in an affirmative form. I 13 think it strengthens it and really keeps us from the 14 requirement for edding the sort of thing that Mr. Bur-15 dette and some others suggested. I wish you would read 16 17 it again. THE CHAIRMAN: Can you give your addition, 18 19 Mr. Sykes? MR. SYKES: All impeachments shall be tried 20 by the Senate and any person impeached shall be convicted
