some other matter this, in a sense, would keep them from doing it. This would be true, wouldn't it, Governor Lane, if you call a special session for one day, it is usually for a particular purpose in mind?

GOVERNOR LANE: That is generally true, yes.

But it has virtue, because usually they know what they

are going to do. It is decided before they meet, and in addition to that, it can all be printed and can be informed.

I question the idea of prolonging it.

DR. BARD: This is why we felt for a special session you need not be restricted on that matter of three clanedar days. We are with you on that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Case?

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I suggest that this
Section 17 should be a mended. In the third line from
the bottom after the word, printed, there should appear
for final reading. This is the law today, and it is a
safeguard, of course, bell ringers and amendments run
through the Legislature in all sorts of fashion. If the
bill is merely printed once, then you can amend it by
striking out everything after the word, a bill, and insert-
