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THE CHAIRMAN: I understand that this provision would also enable the Legislature to fix the date of its convening each year.

DR. BARD: If it so desires. If written into the statute, it would have that authority.

THE CHAIRMAN: The constitution does not fix it.

DR. BARD: The consitution would not fix it.

It would merely say what we are saying here.

THE CHAIRMAN: Do you move the recommendation?

DR. JENKINS: Dr. Bard, I seem to recall our discussion of the desirability if this is adopted of having a provision in another section of the constitution requiring the budget to be passed at a certain time.

DR. BARD: That is correct.

DR. JENKINS: So we would not get into the situation the Federal Congress finds itself that Congressmen may pass appropriations long after the beginning of a fiscal year.

DR. BARD: Mr. Case is not here. I think he would want to make note of this for his Committee's
