and it shall be the duty of the General Assembly in a meeting any Article or Section of the Code of Laws of this State to enact the same as the said Article, or Section would read when amended.

That follows pretty much what we did last time.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any questions or comments? If not, then the last part of your Report deals --

DR. BARD: The last part deals with our own requests, not yours, but ours, that we review those Sections that we felt we had recommended as needing to be deleted and what might be done and the last page, Page 12, indicates our decisions in respect to Sections 30, 32, 34 and 35, and we certainly wish that anyone who is serving on the Committee where we refer to the subject matter belonging to it, by way of illustration, Section 32, feel free to indicate that we ought to be doing it, not they, but here we are indicating, that.

THE CHAIRMAN: So we will know where we stand, let's take up each one.

First, Section 30, you recommend there be no counterpart in the Constitution.
