l vacant.

In other words, if there is a disability that occurs, the lieutenant governor becomes acting governor, in the event the disability exists for six months or longer, the office would be declared vacant and the lieutenant governor would become governor.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any question or comment. Dr. Michener?

DR. MICHENER: This may be anticipating, but
I think there is a conflict between this provision and a
later one. If the governor does notify the lieutenant
governor that he is able to carry out his office, the
duties of his office, then I take it, it is implicit here,
the office of the governor does not become vacant.

JUDGE ADKINS: That is correct.

DR. MICHENER: But there is nothing here to state if the notification to the governor is factual or not, and in President Wilson's case, the actions carried out in his name were actually in effect or not, and all you have here in an indication signed by another governor. You stop the whole procedure.
