disability, it would seem to me necessarily that the two-thirds vote of the General Assembly would prevail because they are not exclusive remedies. They are alternate remedies, and if either occurs, the governor is, in fact, considered to be disabled.

THE CHAIRMAN: But the cycle could start again.

JUDGE ADKINS: The cycle would start again.

THE CHAIRMAN: Does that answer your question

now?

DR. MICHENER: Then you didn't mean if he doesn't give the notice, the office shall not be vacant, because you don't have to mean that when I asked you the first question.

JUDGE ADKINS: You will have to say that again.

DR. MIGHENER: It still could become vacant through action of Section 2 on this first Section, if the governor does notify the lieutenant governor in writing, if he is unable to carry out the duties of his office, the office of the governor shall not be vacant. I asked you if that is what it meant, and I understood you to say Yes.
