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the General Assembly into session to consider this, if you would have the notification from the governor or from the, whoever is signing his name, come at the end of the legislative session, then nothing could be done over a period of approximately nine months, and there would be no one able to call the General Assembly into session. Did the C ommittee consider that?

JUDGE ADKINS: No, frankly, I don't think we did.

THE CHAIRMAN: Had you finished your comment, Judge Adkins?

JUDGE ADKINS: We did not consider it.

MR. MILLER: That is another reason for having the Legislature a continuing body.

MR. MARTINEAU: If there is a question on the lieutenant governor, he would be able to call the Legislature into session to have a decision on this.

JUDGE ADKINS: My offhand opinion would be that that would be a pretty dangerous weapon to give to the lieutenant governor, and I would think perhaps that the continuing disability for the period of nine months
