THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett, you have to ask 2 the question first: What has the Legislature provided by law? 3

> MR. CLAGETT: The Legislature then more or less accepting that as the question jumping to the answer, the Legislature could do as it sees fit provided it did not exceed a total number of 70 days.

> > THE CHAIRMAN: No limit here?

DR. BARD: No limit. Unless they chose to draw as a limit and set different possibilities of extending it. That would be within their sphere of possibility.

JUDGE ADKINS: What does the term provided by law mean in this context?

THE CHAIRMAN: As we are using this phrase generally in the whole constitution we mean as provided by a statute adopted by the Legislature.

It would have to concur in JUDGE ADKINS: the length of the session of the legislative period adopted by the Legislature.
