beginning on Line 7, The credit of the State shall not in any manner be given or loaned to or in aid of any individual, association or corporation, nor shall the General Assembly have the power in any mode to involve the State in the construction of, et cetera.

I will come back to that.

Now, the credit clause, the credit has also been a troublesome, a very troublesome Section, as far as bond attorneys are concerned. It says, The credit of the State shall not in any manner be given or loaned to or in aid of any individual or association or corporation, and the question is what is meant by credit, and does this word have any other meaning than debt, and if so, what is it. An example: Some years ago in Governor McKeldin's administration, it was thought desirable for the State to make available to the Hopkins a substantial sum of money in aid of building, in the Engineering Building. An act was therefore passed authorizing the issuance of bonds, and the idea being that the proceeds of those bonds would be given to the Hopkins. Hopkins is not a part of the State, in the sense that it is part of
