The courts throughout the country in a great number of cases have held that so long as the public purpose has been served, the credit of the State can be used in this way.

There is a great deal of question in the minds of the Committee as to whether these worthwhile projects and projects of modern financing technique can be utilized in Maryland; perfectly obviously they can't be utilized without a long series of litigation, so what the Committee has sought to do is to say that the assets or credit of the State cannot in any manner be given to any individual, et cetera, using the same language, but putting in there the test of public purpose, and also requiring the act of the Legislature which will do this
