indebtedness. It is necessary when you are lending credit, which is much more nebulous, but when you are authorizing bonds to be sold for a certain purpose, it has to say what the purpose is. You just don't borrow ten million dollars. period. You borrow ten million dollars to build a fine arts building at the University of Maryland. DR. BURDETTE: I am not sure that the Legislature would have to do it that way. I would like to be sure that we say it does. MR. CASE: I don't think anybody in the world would suggest that an act which would say the State shall borrow ten million dollars, period, would be a valid law. It has to say what it is for. THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre? MR. SAYRE: The word distinctly specified, I think, would cover a valid point of Dr. Burdette, and it was suggested in the model Constitution, and you are after the specific objects of the indebtedness, isn't that right, Dr. Burdette?

DR. BURDETTE: I don't recall the model.
