for a twenty-five year period, and the students then, the student rentals would have to be considerably higher than under a longer period. For example, for each million dollars at a twenty-five year period, there would have to be collected from students \$40,000 per year to pay for the dormitory, plus the interest and operating expenses. Under a forty-year period, this would be \$25,000. I know from my own experience that the larger sum per year would make the dormitory rentals almost prohibitive.

I think the view in the Committee was that we cannot trust the General Assembly; that unless we put this limitation in the Constitution, the General Assembly will just go haywire on this thing. I do not believe this is true. I believe that the General Assembly will consider each case on its merits. I, therefore, favor not including the twenty-five year period in this last statement.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hoff?

MR. HOFF: I am one of the proponents of the twenty-five year limitation, and I can say that besidelly
