also to comment with respect to the first sentence.

I think the entire Commission has agreed on the principle, that the sentence is intended to authorize the incurring of indebtedness of the State only for public purpose and only upon such terms and conditions and in such manner as the General Assembly by law may prescribe.

It is suggested that that ought to be explicit by the use of the word only and, on motion, the decision was to leave the language as it is now except for the addition of the words, by law, in Line 3.

Would you comment as to your opinion as to the meaning of the sentence as thus drafted?

MR. SACHS: As expressed in here, I will be brief, because it is repetitive. My reading of the sentence and my understanding of the Committee's purpose in drafting the sentence this way was that the words as written do in fact contemplate that this is the only kind of indebtedness that the State can incur. My notion is that the suggested amending language is already implicit and was intended to be implicit in the language as drafted.
