3 completely and to give carte blanche for writing guarantees, 2 which the State may ultimately have to pay for all at once and in a situation which could cause substantial embarrass-:3 r. ment. THE CHAIRMAN: In order to implement your 5 6 statement, do you want to make a motion? I assume you 7 would want to delete Lines 19 and 20? 8 MR. SYKES: Yes, sir. I so move.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second?

MRS. BOTHE: Seconded.

THE CHAIRMAN: All right, the Chairman of the Committee?

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee, with all due respect to my good friend Mr. Sykes who I know and admire as one of our abler young lawyers in our State, his statement shows an abysmal ignorance with respect to the modern technique of municipal finance. Were this done, it would in my judgment set the State of Maryland back one hundred years, right back to 1851, so it would be more than a hundred years, by foreclosing methodologies which have been worked out in the past, not

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
