1 on the magic language part of our indebtedness, it could 2 wreck the finances of Maryland if we signed too many of 3 these collateral things. Somewhere in our Constitution 4 I would deeply like to see some limit, some percentage limit, or something, as to how much credit our State 5 6 could commit, in proportion to what its income is and 7 is foreseen to be, and if we don't have some limit on it, 8 the State of Maryland might some day be in the situation 9 the United States is, which is hopelessly overspent on 10 paper. 11 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? 12 Mr. Mindel?

MR. MINDEL: I'd like to add to the comment Dick Case made. You mentioned Montgomery County as pledging its credit for the Washington suburban district. I believe. I believe Howard County does the same thing for the Metropolitan division and the sewer lines. I would like to ask this question.

Would a restrictive requirement, say a two-thirds vote, whenever the credit was to be used, would that hamper too much the financial world, so far as the State of
