Maryland is concerned, Dick, if you put a little brake on it and required a two-thirds vote?

MR. CASE: Well, I think, in answer to that, that I would merely echo what Steve has said, that the wisdom of the Legislature has got to be relied upon. This Commission is working in that direction in other areas and it seems to me that it would be inconsistent to not do it here.

Fiscal responsibility will tell and will out in the end, and it seems to me that it should be left to the majority of the General Assembly, a Constitutional majority of the General Assembly.

DR. BARD: May I ask a question about the vote in which we are participating? I, for one, believe that Mr. Case has set forth the concept that I would underscore, namely that in modern society I really don't see how we can possibly exist within a frame of reference outside of this possibility, just in terms of the very school with which I am associated, we would be so badly handicapped, in this one illustration.

On the other hand, I do think there ought to be
