some brake, where we ought to have an opportunity -will we have an opportunity to vote on this question of
limitation?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, sir.

DR. BARD: All right.

THE CHAIRMAN: All right, before putting the question, I would like to state my own position. I share to a considerable extent the misgivings expressed by Mr. Sykes and I am going to vote against the motion because it seems to me that the suggested cure for these misgivings and worries, which are very real, is much worse than the disease they would seek to cure.

I do not think that the devices such as were used in the Court of Appeals in the Hopkins case is the answer and it seems to me that even though we must recognize that there is a real risk, that the Legislature feels it easier to write a check when it doesn't actually have to put its name on it; nevertheless, that is a risk which in today's society we will just have to take.
