I am afraid much of the work would still be done in 2 15 or 30 days.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

JUDGE ADKINS: It seems to me there is one premise inherent in this discussion that may be the sense of the Committee -- certainly not mine. That is that we need a Legislature in continuous session.

Comments of Dr. Bard and some of the other members of the Committee are to try to write a plank which involves continuous session.

I at least would like to have an opportunity to vote on this question. I think we by-passed rather cursorily Mr. Mercer Smith's comment that there are a good many segments of the community which are very happy when the Legislature adjourns. I don't think that prolonged legislatures necessarily mean better legislation. I would like to see a vote on the preliminary question.

MR. CLAGETT: Does it say continuous sessions? It says continuous body in regular sessions.

Does that mean the same as continuous sessions?
