immediate entity of the State Government, and yet one much concerned, too, that in this modern society we simply must move forward, I want to say that I think this requirement for an extraordinary majority would meet much of the legitimate objections we raised because, to get an extraordinary majority, some word would have to go out in the Legislature that you fellows have to turn out, if you believe in it, and, as a consequence, there would be a more widespread discussion of the merits of this extended credit.

I gather from the fact that there have been no statements to contrary, that after it had passed the Legislature, there would be no difficulty at all in the financing. I certainly cannot conceive that it would hurt. Therefore, I want to say I endorse this and it makes me feel very much better about extending credit beyond the affairs of the State.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Are you ready for the question? The Chair wants to state his position.
