it also said subject to referendum.

Now, if the courts should hold that a veterans bonus is a public purpose, it could be authorized under this section without a referendum, which is a departure from the present provision. Has your Committee any views concerning that?

MR. CASE: No, sir. We think that, as a

Constitutional matter, if the Legislature wants to authorize
a bond issue for veterans of Vietnam, they ought to be able
to do so without having to go through a referendum.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then may I state that the position

of your Committee is that if a veterans bonus is a public purpose and so held by the court, it could be authorized by the Legislature and it should not be determined in the Constitution whether such a bonus is or is not a public purpose.

MR. CASE: That is correct.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any comment as to that matter particularly? Mr. Sykes?

MR. SYKES: Mr. Chairman, as a practical matter, there is additional reason why that is very good policy
