and that is one of the reasons that bonus bills were passed by one or another Houses and merely enacted, these little cld bonus bills in the past, why it became so much of a question was in the Legislature it would often be said all they are asking is the right to let the people vote and it can lead to buck-passing, and I think once you give the Legislature the responsibility, you can let it exercise it in the normal course. It's its responsibility.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Brooks?

MR. BROOKS: One final question. In light of the interpretation of the first sentence and one other thing that might otherwise challenge it, if we do not say more, is if the State should have incurred already any debt for a non-public purpose or if there is no determination at the moment as to whether some debts incurred are for public purpose, does the Committee have any particular position on whether or not, with the adoption of this Constitution, such debts would be declared null and void or could be declared such by the courts, if found they were not for public purpose, without
