treated.

MR. CLAGETT: I think that pretty well covers

it, Mr. Chairman, except I think it should be more specific,
in a schedule, in the Constitution.

THE CHAIRMAN: We talked about a saving provision in the Constitution and no one has undertaken to draft it. Any further discussion of this section?

Mr. Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: I would move this motion to submit for consideration, to be reported back at the next meeting, something to the effect, and I'm going to borrow bodily from the Alaskan Constitution, the proceeds of any State tax or license shall not be dedicated to any special purpose except when required by the Federal Government for State participation in a Federal program. This provision shall not prohibit any programs existing from the date of ratification on the people of Maryland, and we could add to that, if it is a problem, any existing assets or credit given contrary to the provisions of this Constitution otherwise proper and legal shall be honored to the date of their termination.
