THE CHAIRMAN: Does anyone second the motion?

Is there a second? Apparently not, Mr. Sayre. Well, let's take a break for a few moments for the reporter to change the tape.

(At this point there was a short recess.)

THE CHAIRMAN: We are now ready to go ahead with the first consideration on the fourth report of the Committee on the judiciary department. This is the report you received a few days ago, dated September 12, 1966, fourth report. Is there anyone who doesn't have a copy?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Mr. Chairman, I move its

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Nr. Charrman, 1 more 200

I have suggested to the Chairman of the Committee that since you have had the third report, of which this is essentially a copy, for more than a month and everyone has read it and studied it closely and since you have had the benefit of the general presentation made by the Chairman of the Committee at the last meeting of the Commission, it should not be necessary this time to have the preliminary or general background presentation at all
