 that the problem is not with each Chairman's explanation, but the long-winded debate; but, as he been said to you, these names have been debated back and forth time and time again, have been considered with the State Bar Committee and with the Committee of the Judicial Conference and these are the names which by far have won the approval of a great majority of the people who have considered this.

For this reason, I would hope that the names would be approved right now and we could move on to more substantial matters.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any further discussion?

Are we ready for the question? The question arises on the approval of Section 1, which means essentially approval of the names of the four courts. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary, no. The ayes have it and it is so ordered.

Now, at the last meeting, we got down -- where did we get on this?
