2 but the long-winded debate; but, as has been said to you,
3 these names have been debated back and forth time and time
4 again, have been considered with the State Bar Committee
5 and with the Committee of the Judicial Conference and
6 these are the names which by far have won the approval
7 of a great majority of the people who have considered this.

8 For this reason, I would hope that the names
9 would be approved right now and we could move on to more
10 substantial matters.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any further discussion?
12 Are we ready for the question? The question arises on the
13 approval of Section 1, which means essentially approval
14 of the names of the four courts. All those in favor signify
15 by saying aye. Contrary, no. The ayes have it and it is
16 so ordered.

17 Now, at the last meeting, we got down -- where
18 did we get on this?
