sent back to us by the 8 to 7 vote, with the direction
to redraft it and provide that the Supreme Court and the
General Assembly would have concurrent power on all matters
contained in those three different items, that is, the
practice and procedure, the admission and discipline of

members of the Bar and the administration of the courts.

Now, as you can see, the first Section 7, as we have in the report on Page 30, and running over to 31, is drafted in accordance with the 8 to 7 vote. The Committee, however, in considering this again has proposed that the rule -- has proposed an alternate which is found at the bottom of Page 31, and we provide there that the rule of the court will be paramount in the event there is any conflict between an act of the General Assembly and the ruling of a court.

Now, I think this matter needs a little more discussion than it had last time. We have two additional
