can state in recent instances, the Rules Committee. 1 rather than act, has asked the Legislature to act, haven't 2 you? 3 MR. SYKES: Yes. 4 By doing that, weren't you giving MR. SAYRE: 5 the power to the judiciary to let the Legislature determine 6 it? 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, but on the substantive 8 law, it divides whether that is what the Legislature 9 10 intended. MRS. BOTHE: I'm on the Committee and perhaps 11 I should have brought this up in one of our meetings, 12 but I notice on reading the proposed alternate draft, 13 the language that is now used in Article III, Section 14 18(a), on the rule-making power, has been deleted and that 15 is the language that says that the rule shall have the 16 force of law until rescinded, changed or modified, et cetera. 17 There is nothing in this proposal that gives 18

the rules the force of law and I don't recall discussing

this in the Committee, as to whether it was necessary to

perpetuate that principle in the Constitution; but it is
