into the area of jurisdiction, but if you are thinking
of it technically, in the sense of venue, I think it is
a mixed question. It is one of those areas where the
Rules Committee has usually deferred to the Legislature.

On the other hand, when you are speaking of removal, the rules presently provide the methods by which removal is accomplished. The statute provides the cases in which one is entitled to removal. So that the procedure by which you obtain your removal is prescribed by rule. Your right to removal is prescribed by the Legislature, just as the right of appeal is legislative.

The procedure by which you perfect your appeal is pursuant to rules.

MR. MILLER: And it is a sort of open question, is it? For instance, I'm thinking about the possible District Courts we're thinking of setting up that might deprive some areas of a resident judge. Would that be procedural, if the Court decided that you could bring the case in some other County?

THE CHAIRMAN: I would take it that would be a question which would be resolved by legislation. That
