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I would say that the Supreme

Court in that sense was supreme. It decides, just as if 2 an act of the Legislature is unconstitutional, the Legis-3 lature has to live with it, and that is it. 4 It has held its own rule unconsti-MR. SYKES: 5 tutional when its merit was argued at length before it. 6 THE CHAIRMAN: Anything further? 7 If you have a time period in here, MR. SAYRE: 8 would that be undue restriction? 9 THE CHAIRMAN: If you are asking me, I think 10 it would be a knot-tying procedure. The rules must be 11 permitted to operate continuously and to have a period 12 when you are not sure what the rule is, I think, would be 13 14 very bad. MR. SAYRE: Well, with your persuasiveness, 15 I am entirely sold on the alternate approach. 16 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions? 17 MR. BROOKS: One other point, Mr. Chairman, 18 in answer to Mr. Clagett whose question was whether or 19 not this would be in violation of general political thought 20 and theory.
