

1 DR. BURDETTE: Where is this?

2 MR. MARTINEAU: This is on Page 31, the one  
3 we have just gone over. This is included in both Sections  
4 7, but it was a new matter in the last draft and I wanted  
5 to bring it to the Commission's attention, so if there is  
6 any problem with this, it can be raised now.

7 DR. BURDETTE: The question I would raise is  
8 what is the interpretation of the Committee with respect  
9 to this, about the pardoning power of the Governor and  
10 his actions and so forth?

11 MR. MARTINEAU: If I understood your question,  
12 it doesn't relate to it at all.

13 DR. BURDETTE: I'm glad to hear you say so.  
14 I'm just wondering where they get limited. This comes  
15 about from your language, officers of the executive depart-  
16 ment to the extent that their duties directly relate to  
17 the enforcement of judicial orders.

18 Now, could they order the Governor to declare  
19 marshall law, for example?

20 MR. MARTINEAU: Well, it would obviously have  
21 to be a Constitutional exercise of judicial power. I doubt
