very seriously whether that would be a Constitutional 1 exercise of a judiciary executive. 2 MR. SYKES: Another answer would be you have 3 to have a judicial order before you have any body to carry 4 the duty out and the judicial order would be a writ of 5 execution or a judgment for somebody, or something of that 6 kind. 7 Who is going to administer it? DR. BURDETTE: 8 Excuse me? THE CHAIRMAN: 9 DR. BURDETTE: For example, would this flow 10 to the administration of the State penitentiary? 11 THE CHAIRMAN: A judicial order is an order 12 entered in a judicial proceeding and, in Maryland, we do 13 not have judicial proceedings except in the adversary 14 15 sense. MR. MARTINEAU: You could, in this sense, a 16 writ of habeas corpus directing him to bring a man into 17 court. 18 This you have now. THE CHAIRMAN: 19 MR. MARTINEAU: That is nothing different than 20 we have now. I don't think this really changes the law as 21
