MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, a question of Mr. Martineau. Does this contemplate that the sheriff is an officer of the judicial department?

MR. MARTINEAU: We brought this out purposely. We don't know, exactly. He is obviously an executive in some capacity. He is the chief police officer in some counties. The reference to the sheriff is in Article IV, the Judicial Arm. He has many duties relating directly to the judicial department. I am not sure, frankly, whether he is an officer of the judiciary or an officer of the executive.

THE CHAIRMAN: But whether he is one or the other, under this Section, his duties in the enforcement of judicial orders is subject to court order.

MR. MARTINEAU: That is right. That is why we phrased this the way we did.
