THE CHAIRMAN: We did discuss it, but we didn't

MR. MINDEL: Suppose a lawyer was appointed to a judgeship and then two years later moves out of the district or circuit. What happens:

 $\mbox{MR. CASE:} \mbox{ The Court of Appeals did that for eighteen years.}$

MR. MINDEL: Then he stands for election. The election has no residence requirement at all.

MR. SAYRE: Conversely, suppose a circuit was redistricted?

MR. MARTINEAU: As this is drafted, there is no requirement that once he is appointed he is required to continue to reside there. I think there are a few circumstances where this has happened. I have heard of other judges who have done exactly the same thing. We are not going to require that he continue to maintain his residence there.

In 99 per cent of the cases, he does and no question has ever been raised.
