THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hargrove?

MR. HARGROVE: It doesn't bother me so much, as a member of the Committee, removing the requirement of residency in the county, but I think there should be some requirement that he at least be a resident of the State. If you remove these, you don't have any such requirement. You could conceivably have someone who has been a member of the Maryland Bar for five years, living in the District of Columbia and elsewhere, who conceivably, if he could get through the Nominating Committee, be appointed a Judge in the State and would have no connection whatsoever with any problems of the State.

So, I think, with the suggestion made, that amendments could be attached, and I think it would be beneficial.

MRS. BOTHE: I would suggest, Mr. Eney, adding to my motion that to Paragraph A of the first paragraph there be added, and I think it could be done at the end, no fewer than five years next prior to his nomination to be a resident of the State of Maryland.
