MR. MARTINEAU: Yes. I think the term election necessary includes the concept of nominations.

MR. CLAGETT: In the event of an integrated

Bar, that would mean probably the Bar Association?

MR. MARTINEAU: I can tell you, this is how
it is done in Missouri which does have a unified Bar.
It is done through that organization.

MR. CLAGETT: If, however, a non-integrated

Bar takes place, I think we have a very peculiar situation
blossoming here.

MR. MARTINEAU: This is why we had to leave it

to the rule of court. It is going to have to be established by rule the means for setting up this procedure. You are going to have to have ways of holding elections, how lawyers register, who is going to determine whether they are practicing lawyers, what lawyers can vote, whether it has to be a practicing lawyer or someone who has just been admitted to the Bar. All of these things are going to have to be decided by the rule. Trying to set them out in the Constitution is well nigh impossible.

MR. CLAGETT: I agree with that.
