

1 a practice which, so far as we are aware, has been con-
2 demned by everyone, including most judges of the State.

3 The next is the usual provision providing that
4 compensation of the judge shall not be reduced during his
5 continuance in office. It provides for the payment of
6 pensions to judges and requires that the judges of the
7 same court be paid the same amount of money.

8 The second paragraph there is the prohibition
9 against the judge practicing law, running for elective
10 office or making any contribution to or holding office
11 in a political organization, political party or taking
12 part in any partisan political campaign or receiving any
13 remuneration for his judicial services, other than author-
14 ized.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: I think you should add that in
16 Section 12 there is a provision that the judge should be
17 compensated solely by the State for his judicial services.

18 MR. MARTINEAU: We thought it would be that there
19 would be no other compensation, each judge in the same
20 court will receive the same salary, no matter where he is
21 a judge, and he shall receive his only compensation from
