a practice which, so far as we are aware, has been condemned by everyone, including most judges of the State.

The next is the usual provision providing that compensation of the judge shall not be reduced during his

continuance in office. It provides for the payment of pensions to judges and requires that the judges of the

same court be paid the same amount of money.

The second paragraph there is the prohibition against the judge practicing law, running for elective office or making any contribution to or holding office in a political organization, political party or taking part in any partisan political campaign or receiving any remuneration for his judicial services, other than authorized.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think you should add that in Section 12 there is a provision that the judge should be compensated solely by the State for his judicial services.

MR. MARTINEAU: We thought it would be that there
would be no other compensation, each judge in the same
court will receive the same salary, no matter where he is
a judge, and he shall receive his only compensation from
