interfering with the performance of his duties, which is, or is likely to become, of a permanent character. This might be called the Judge Berry provision of the Constitution.

The judge may not sit in any proceeding involving his own removal or retirement. The Supreme Court is given the authority by rule or order to implement or enforce this section.

This was put in there this way so that the

court could by rule establish a commission which would do all of the investigation in the recommendations to the court. We put it in this way rather than following the method that is in the Constitutional amendment which will be voted on this fall. The Constitutional amendment actually establishes a judicial disability commission and decides how proceedings shall be run and how it should

make its recommendations and various things like that.

We thought that was much too cumbersome to put in here and we just put in this short sentence stating that the Supreme Court shall appoint. We then provide what happens to a judge who retires or is removed.
