4 THE CHAIRMAN: He would be elected by the
5 people of the district. He just need not be a resident
6 of the particular district.

7 MR. MILES: Just as bad.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: It may be.

9 DR. BARD: I would remind you, Mr. Chairman,
10 and , Mr. Miles, that this holds true for Congressional
11 representation now in Maryland. Is that not true,
12 Congressman Miller?

13 MR. MILLER: So I understand.

14 MRS. FREEDLANDER: No provision in the
15 United States Constitution for that.

16 DR. BARD: I want to be fair that our
17 Committee was not as tightly united on this part as
18 the first part but as far as Congressional representa-
19 tion is concerned, there are no qualifications.
