Section 13? All right, Section 14.

MR. MARTINEAU: The last section in this,

Section 14, provides for clerks of court. It provides

that the Chief Justice of each court shall appoint a

chief clerk for that particular court. So, we will have
four chief clerks of the judicial system. It also pro
vides that there shall be a chief clerk of the Superior

Court in each county and for each division of the District

Courts, so that each place where the court sits will have
a clerk in residence there.

Then it provides for their appointment and the terms shall be governed by rule. This is, of course, a departure from the present system under which the clerks of the Circuit Court are elected for a specific term, but it does not vary from the procedure for the Court of Appeals and the new Court of Special Appeals, and I believe some of the minor courts in Baltimore City have the right to appoint their own clerk.

JUDGE ADKINS: Does this mean that the clerks would not have the benefit of civil service?
